Contents

This module provides an introduction to the study of popular music and culture in theory and method. Perspectives from ethnomusicology, popular music studies, and cultural studies maybe included. Case studies may be drawn from Western and/or non-Western, contemporary and/or historical popular music cultures.

Upon successful completion of this module, students should be able to demonstrate: a critical understanding of popular music practices as both musical and sociocultural processes; a basic familiarity with theoretical frameworks and methodological approaches for studying popular musics; and the ability to critically reflect on and effectively communicate popular music topics.
