Contents					
The module deals with problems in the relationship between music and socio-culturally shaped concepts of space in an exemplary manner. This includes optionally, depending on the nature of the chosen subject matter concepts of the cultural term "Region" and methods and aims of regional music research; Urbanism (especial-ly the specificity of musical centres) and the reflection on the relationship between cultural centre and periphery; Questions of spatial sociology including historical concepts of space and topics (spatial ordering systems and mappings), social spaces with their specific music; Approaches of promenadology in connection with the concept of soundscapes; Finally an aesthetics and poetics of space related to the social space (G. Bachelard), insofar as it shapes musical concepts in a significant way.					
Intended learning outcomes					
The student understands the relationship of music and place in a multi-layered way by learning to differentia- te concepts of place, space* and region socio-culturally, historically and aesthetically. He/she is able to under- stand and describe "space" as something that is not given in advance, but as a cultural construction and some- thing that has become.
